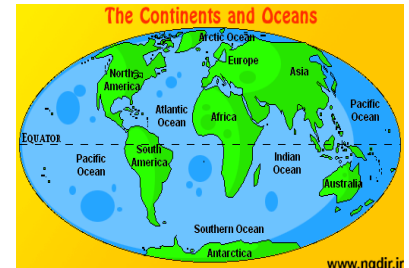
By the end of Year 2 I will have added to my sticky Geography knowledge to include:

Locational Knowledge

There are 7 continents – Europe, Africa, Australasia, Asia, North America, South America and Antarctica.

There are 5 oceans – the Pacific, Atlantic, Indian, Southern and Arctic oceans.

The four countries of the United Kingdom are separately run with capital cities but the UK government is located overall in London.



Place Knowledge

The capital cities of the UK are London, Edinburgh, Cardiff and Belfast.

There is a flag for each country in the UK but they combine to make the Union Jack.

Doncaster is the nearest city to Finningley and has some features in common with London but others that are different.

Miami in Florida, North America has a very different climate and environment to Doncaster and life is different in some ways as a child living there compared to Doncaster, but the same in others.

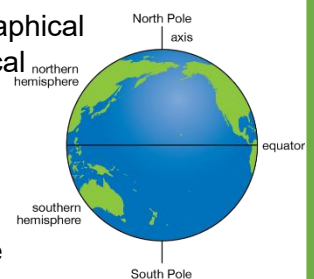


Human and Physical Geography
