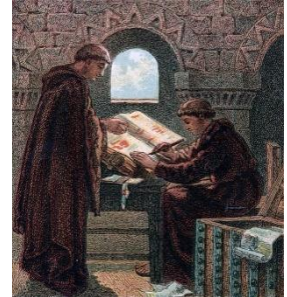
### Medieval Britain

Medieval Britain was the period of time from the fall of the Roman Empire to the Tudor times.

The loss of knowledge after the Romans left led to the 'Dark Ages'.

The Domesday Book began the process of recording knowledge again and led to improvements in society.

The Black Death (bubonic plague) killed one third of Europeans and led to the introduction of taxes.



### Ancient Egypt

The Ancient Egyptian civilisation spanned for 3000 years to the start of the Roman Empire in 30 BC.

They were based along the River Nile and irrigated their fields.

The Ancient Egyptians were skilled in many areas including construction and built monuments such as the Pyramids and the Sphinx to honour Pharaohs.

They created a system of writing which enabled them to record and transfer knowledge.



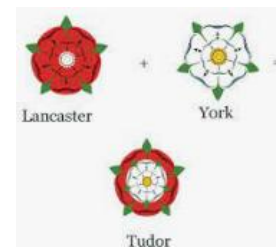
### The Tudors

Henry VII was the first Tudor king after winning the 'War of the Roses' between the houses of York and Lancaster.

Henry VIII was the founder of the Church of England and had 6 wives, some of whom he beheaded.

Queen Elizabeth I was the first female monarch of England.

Tudor England was a farming society and the development of the mining of coal, tin and lead increased wealth.
